Oyen FCSS is very pleased to announce the acquisition of a new facility to house the youth program. This new Community Centre is in the provincial building on Main Street where the "old liquor store" was located. Along with being the new venue for FCSS youth programming this space will be open for use by Mental Health and Wellness, FCSS Volunteer services, family movie nights, Summer Fun Leadership Program along with other service groups who may like to make use of the facility.

We are very excited to start the preparation process on this new building so we can move the youth program as soon as possible. The new building will provide ample space for youth activities and further program development. This space has been vacant for ten years and is in desperate need of renovations.

Phase One will consist of painting, floor preparation, carpentry, plumbing, electrical, and kitchenette installation, with an estimated cost of \$25,000 worth of funding, which FCSS is actively searching for. If you are able to help paint, clean, move supplies, or make garbage runs, any volunteer assistance would be greatly appreciated. . Phase Two will be the installation of a wheel chair accessible washroom.

We are hoping to get started on renovations in April and May, with the facility opening at the beginning of June. 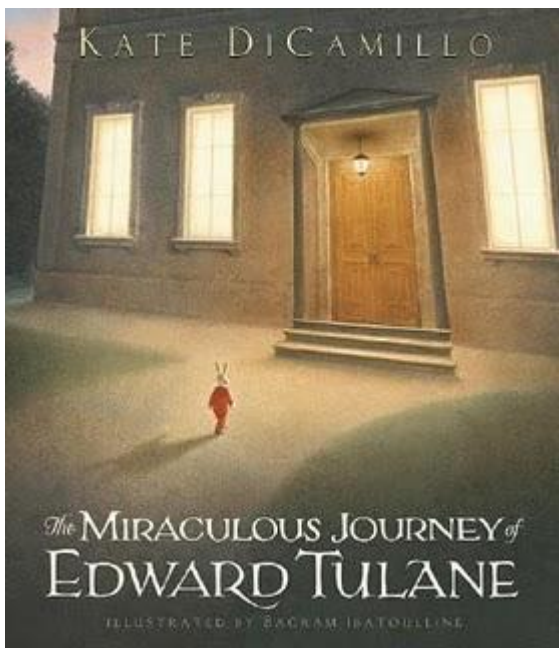

puzzle

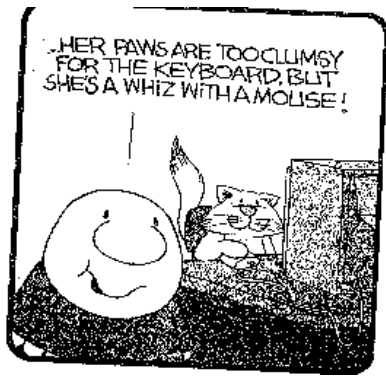

## Machell's Mirror

It's hard to believe that almost two weeks have been completed since Easter! The 130<sup>th</sup> day of school was last Tuesday, and with it we had yet another visit from Decimal Dot and Zero the Hero. Decimal Dot challenged the children with numbers, and the children challenged Zero the Hero with spelling words.

In Math, we continue to work on number facts to twenty and beyond, along with daily work on the calendar and its patterns.

We can see where Charity's heart lies ó on the farm! 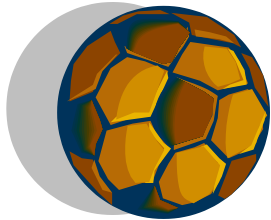

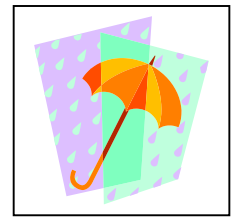
